REFLECTIONS

"Calling them like ${\cal D}$ see them"

Easter is a holiday about becoming. That's not necessarily a unique aspect of the Christian faith. Many holidays in many different traditions hold a spring festival of some kind around the idea of renewal, new life, and beginnings. For Christians, this season vividly expresses those ideas and it emphasizes that there is no new life without death. There is no empty tomb without the cross, to put it into expressly religious terms.

Easter holds more for us than recognizing an event from 2,000 years ago. It means that we, too, can become new. That's the promise of Easter. With the power of God, we may truly change and become something new. We can chart a new course for our lives, we can move past the mistakes of yesterday, we can work toward a new potential. The stone is rolled away and the tomb is empty. Behold all things are made new.

But there is no new life without death; no empty tomb without the cross.

In order to become new, in order to make a new life, we have to lose the old one. If we would dare to be something more than what we have been, then we must die to what has come before. The miracle of Easter is that it is completely possible to have a new life. That's possible. That is what the cross and the empty tomb *mean*. But there's a price. We cannot at once live the way that we have been living *and* have a new life. That doesn't work. We have to move away from the old in order to become new.

There's a story about Jesus talking with some rich, young guy who has it all figured out. He knows the law, he lives right, and Jesus says he lacks one thing. He's got to divest his wealth, give it to those without wealth and follow Jesus' way. Guy goes away depressed and the disciples are wondering how any of this is possible. If it's harder for a rich person to get on board with the Kingdom (the Jesus way of life), then how can anyone do it?

"With God, all things are possible," Jesus answers. Becoming new is hard. Change is not easy which is why so few people do it. But God raised Jesus from the dead and that means that with God, all things are possible. It doesn't mean they will be easy or without pain. But it's possible. Happy Easter!
