# REFLECTIONS

*"Calling them like I see them"*

Many of you know that our family has been in the weeds here recently with Gigi having a work injury on her hand. Some of you know that my mother also had cataract surgery recently (because you've been gracious enough to talk to her about it and try to reassure her). And a good many of you have been asking about how I'm doing because you know that in the middle of all of this, I'm trying to care for everyone and get everyone where they need to go.

First, let me use my privilege of a platform to thank you for all of that. People have sent cards and brought meals and texted and asked and prayed. Lots and lots of prayers. Thank you, genuinely. We're all grateful for the support and I'm very grateful since it was a lot of me to try to be there for everyone in my family when they all needed me at once. You helped alleviate that pressure and I'm grateful.

But on the heels of that, I'm also grateful for the reminder of one of the best parts of church family. When you need support, when the pressure is building, when you feel like there are too many needs and not enough of you to go around, that's what church does really well. There are times when it can feel like most of church life is just running from one meeting to the next, one event to the next, one project to the next until the calendar turns over and we start all over again. It is that, but all of that serves to hold us together for when church family is needed.

I've been refreshing on my marriage counseling materials recently (new resources have come to light), but I still rely on one that's been around for decades now. It's one from the Gottman Institute. Anyway, the Gottman theory is that successful marriages aren't really about big gestures, finding just the right compatibility partner, or some secret set of rituals. Their theory is that marriages are really a bunch of very small little relational moments that stack up to make us resilient for trying times. It's all of the little inside jokes, moments of holding hands, 4-minute phone calls, and a lifetime of getting your spouse a cup of water that makes sure a marriage lasts.

I've been reminded that this is definitely true of the church. It may seem small to eat a Thanksgiving potluck together, or show up on Wednesdays for a business meeting once a quarter, or shake hands on Sunday mornings, but those small things add up. And then when a kindergartener oopsies your wife's thumb in the wrong direction, you've got what you need to survive.

Thanks for all the little things we do together, church. It really helps.

## *Before His Presence with Singing*

*"Take my gifts and let me love you"*

I'm amazed at the many ways in which God loves me that I take for granted. Stuff I rarely think about. Daily stuff like waking up. Able to rise from a sleepy bed. Able to mobilize myself to work. Able to work! And what blessed work!

This hymn is from our own time, published in 1992 and speaks plainly and directly to our stewardship of what God has given us.

Shirley Erena Murray was one of the twentieth century's greatest hymnwriters. She was born and lived in New Zealand and has penned several profound hymns. As you will see with this hymn, when you read it below, she has a gift for plain speak and clarity.

I love her assertion that "because your (God's) love has touched me, I have love to give away." And the imagery in that same stanza that, "now the bread of love is rising, loves of love to multiply."

Later she refers to the harvest of Christ's own compassion as the "juice that make the wine of God."

Stanza two is a delight to sing, referring to laughter and humor, and flavor and tang! When's the last time you sang about tang?

The final stanza begins, "Take whatever I can offer — gifts that I have yet to find..." What a prayer! So very current! So pertinent and relevant. Need to brush up on stewardship? Read this hymn:

Take my gifts and let me love You,  
God who first of all loved me,  
gave me light and food and shelter,  
gave me life and set me free.  
Now because Your love has touched me,  
I have love to give away,  
now the bread of love is rising,  
Loaves of love to multiply.

Take the fruit that I have gathered  
from the tree Your Spirit sowed,  
harvest of Your own compassion,  
juice that makes the wine of God,  
spiced with humor, laced with laughter —  
flavor of the Jesus life,  
tang of risk and new adventure,  
Tast and zest beyond belief.

Take whatever I can offer —  
gifts that I have yet to find,  
skills that I am slow to sharpen,  
talents of the hand and mind,  
things made beautiful for others  
in the place where I must be:  
take my gifts and let me love You,  
God who first of all loved me.
